



# CCW CARRYING GUIDE











## A List of Where You CAN and CAN'T Carry

Updated March 1 2026

### YES! YOU CAN CARRY HERE

-  Healthcare Facilities.
-  Movie theatres (unless they serve alcohol for consumption at their theatre)
-  Public transit and mass transit facilities.
-  Public gatherings.
-  Private property that you own or do not own.
-  Retail stores (like Wal-Mart, Target, clothing stores, grocery stores, hardware stores, malls, etc.) with or without a "NO GUNS" sign posted.
-  Driving past a school on a public street.
-  National parks.
-  Indian reservations, but NOT their casinos.  
NOTE: Technically, each reservation makes its own rules and can change at any time. You must check before you go into a reservation to know for sure.
-  Gas Stations
-  Bureau of Land Management (BLM) federal land

### NO! YOU CAN'T CARRY HERE

-  Establishments where alcoholic drinks are sold for consumption while on the premises like a bar, bar and grill, restaurants with a full bar, or a brewery. This also includes restaurants that sell only beer and/or wine, but does not include grocery stores or liquor stores because it is not being consumed on their property. (Reminder: CA prohibits the consumption of alcohol and prohibits being under the influence of any controlled substance while carrying a concealed weapon.)
-  Public parks and athletic facilities.
-  Public property controlled by the State Department of Parks and Recreation or Department of Fish and Wildlife.
-  Gambling establishments.
-  Stadiums and arenas (PETCO Stadium, Del Mar Fairgrounds, Sports Arena, North Island Credit Union Amphitheater, Snapdragon Stadium, etc.)
-  All Airport Property.
-  Federal, state, or city government buildings like courthouses, city halls, law enforcement offices, elected official offices.
-  All property owned by the County of San Diego like parks, rec centers, and the County Administration Building.
-  Military bases, all school property, and post offices.
-  A political protest of any kind and polling stations for voting in elections.
